also to those who provide rides for other people in the congregation - you are angels!



ANNUAL MEETING - January 26, 2014

President Goodine noted that active member count decreased this year from 73 to 63 and that we had lost 14 members over the last two years. A moment of silence was observed for those who have left this earth this past year to be with God: Faith Ames, Lorelie Robie, William (Billy) Farrington, John Spangler, and Mildred Priest. Abigail Maxwell was the only new member in 2013.

Approved By-law Revisions:

Article 4.10 President.

4.10 (d). The Finance Officer cannot serve as President of the Council

Article 4.13 Treasurer/Financial Officer(s). 4.13 (i). The Finance Officer cannot serve as President of the Council

Article 5.5 Finance & Stewardship Committee. 5.5 (7). The church shall not be in the business of loaning money. In the event that the church becomes aware of a family or person in need, the Council may vote to give a financial gift to the needy person. The Council may elect to take a collection from the congregation for this purpose.

In addition, even with a reduction in the upcoming budget, there is a shortfall in revenue. The Council voted to transfer \$8,000 from the Living Memorial Fund to the Church

Fund would still have a balance over \$50,000.

General Account so the Treasurer would have funds to cover current expenses. The proposed 2014 budget, with transfer of funds, was approved by members. Our by-laws do not require that

by-laws do not require that this money be paid back to the Memorial Fund, but if it is financially possible, we will do so. The by-laws do require this transfer have the approval of the Finance Committee. Ron Emery mentioned that the Living Memorial
