Missions & Benevolence:

As of the end of the first quarter, we had expended \$323.78 for family food and \$47.33 for flowers, so we are currently within our budgeted funds to assist the two families with

monthly food. These purchases are supplemented by donations from our church congregation. Committee members appreciate the food and personal supplies that are donated, and also the monetary donations from those who do not like to shop. Rosie will keep us notified, via the bulletin, as the birthdays for the children arrive and remember, in some cases, our gifts are the only gifts the children receive. Thanks to Rosie and Angela for the grocery shopping and coordinating the pick-up of food by the families.

Thanks to Marge Kurtzman for providing the Easter baskets, which you so generously filled for the 3 adults and 3 children. Also, thanks to Marge for organizing the baby shower gifts for our friend, Jessica Tarr. Congratulations to Jessica and her new baby boy!

Thanks to Joan Ferrone who has researched and found that all funds collected go to the "Any Soldier" program. She started collecting donations and our first gift of \$28.00 has already been sent. Please keep this very worthy project in mind and, as Joan said, "Just give me a dollar or two when you can and I will hold it until I get enough to send."

On May 4 we were informed by Sheldon Goodine of a very needy local family with four children. The little girl uses a small trundle bed and the three boys share a bed with Mom. Sheldon said there is a separate room available and the immediate need was to provide a bunk bed for the boys. After checking the newspaper and finding no used beds listed, I made several telephone calls to check prices, asking for any available discounts for a church purchase, and then made a visit to a Waterville store. They had metal bunk beds and very nice mattresses on sale, so we purchased one metal bunk bed (the two smaller boys will have to share a bunk) and the two mattresses for a total of \$359.85. The store generously donated four new, fluffy pillows for the children and an appropriate acknowledgement of their gift has been sent. New twin sheet sets and three throw quilts have been donated, as well as

some good condition used pillow cases. You should have seen me, with the two mattresses tied on top of my Rav-4, driving a sedate 40 mph to Sheldon's house! The bed was in an

Augusta store; Sheldon picked that up and by now has delivered and set up the bed for the boys. Thanks to him & Joyce for their assistance.

Since our budgeted money is projected to be used for food, the Benevolence Committee is respectfully requesting donations to offset this unexpected expense. Please make your check out to the church and mark "Bunk Bed/Mattress Fund" in the memo section. Good condition twin bedding may also be brought to the church and given to Sheldon, as he is our contact with this family. Buildings & Grounds:

Well, the new wall is finished in the sanctuary. It was a long time coming, but with the help of Steve Hadsell, the wooden paneling was removed and sheet rock installed in its place. The Prestons did about all of the painting. Thanks to Carl Schroeder for building the new chair rails and frame for the stained glass window.

Due to the cold and snowy winter, the property maintenance and supplies portion of the operations budget has a \$275.93 negative balance. Plowing alone was more than half the budget.

We still need to have the walls of the crawl space under the sanctuary spray-foamed with a budget price cost of about \$1,000. Materials have been purchased to install lights in the crawl space; this will be done before the spray foam is applied. With the 6% annual withdrawal from the Meader Family Fund, we will end this year in the black with all projects finished.

The old hot air furnace is mostly dissembled and soon will be gone, so that new storage shelving can be built. This will make storage identification easier. - Sheldon Goodine, Chair

Communications & Outreach:

We are also looking at a town-wide summer resident cookout, possibly in July, to invite new folks to visit our church.

We had a wonderful music group, "Heavenly Sound," perform at the church on May 4. Turn-out was not heavy, but those who did attend had a very blessed event.

The monthly contemporary service (1st Sunday

of every month at 5PM) is a chance to learn some modern Christian music and share with other Christians. We are so thankful to have Archie (Dave Archibauld) assist us with the music. Ian



Maxwell has been a tremendous help also. This is a rather informal gathering and a good chance to invite friends.

Somewhere in this issue you will read about the newly formed "Growth Committee." No, it's not about some horrid bodily part, but about growing our church. A lot of ideas are being discussed about how to increase membership, but I know that we will grow if we commit this to prayer and continue to place God first and spread the gospel through His love. Numbers are not the main focus; spiritual growth is most important and then I believe the numbers will come.

MUSIC MINISTRY

Our worship service contains quite a bit of music. Each musical offering has its own role within the service. Let us examine what these roles are and how each piece is chosen to satisfy the intended purpose:



<u>Prelude</u>: The bell has been rung and the initial period of meditation is concluded with a piece chosen to separate the congregation from outside concerns and invite them into the service.

<u>Introit</u>: This is the formal beginning of our worship. It is usually brief and sets the tenor of the service in regard to liturgical seasons or a more specific event (e.g., Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, Palm Sunday, etc.). The introit is often abbreviated and is sung for a benediction.

<u>Hymns</u>: The opening and closing hymns tend to be more spirited, the middle hymn more subdued. All are chosen with the week's message, influencing their selection. At times, the first and third hymns are chosen for their suitability to open or close a service.

The communion hymn is chosen to prepare us for the liturgical meal to follow.

<u>Music Ministry</u>: This, more than any other piece of music, should speak to the scriptural message and reading and should prepare us for scripture reading to follow. The music should create a solemn silence when finished, so that we are more open to hear the word of God. This may not always happen for any

number of reasons, but is still the focused objective.

<u>Incidental Music</u>: During the offering (after the second scripture reading is done and during the distribution of communion) music is played to provide a platform for meditation and to enhance the solemn mood.

<u>Benediction</u>: This may be the same as the introit or a statement appropriate to close a service.

The purpose of all the music should always be to enhance our worship service. Many members of the congregation are active participants and bring an eclectic flavor to the music presented.

Service music is an ornament. Scriptural is the substance. Let us not pay too much attention to what is secondary and let us focus on the word. - Love and peace, Chris Farris

Finance & Stewardship:

South China Community Church began 2014 with a budget of \$63,035. This is about \$5,000 less than last year's budget. At the end of the first quarter, account balances were:

Checking Account: \$7595.61
Savings Account 3856.30
Memorial Fund: 52,599.00
Faith Ames Music Fund: 2103.06
Meader Family Fund: 36,271.51

Our total quarterly inflows were \$23,615.14; and total quarterly outflows were \$17,346.94. Projected quarterly revenue/expenses are \$15,758.75. Although it appears we have brought in much more than projected, the actual inflows include a transfer of \$8,000 from our Memorial Account to balance the budget. So, we are actually right on target as far as our revenue is concerned. We have spent a bit more than we should have by now, our major expenses have predominantly due to Buildings & Grounds projects and worship supplies that are not recurring. Overall, our quarterly expenses amount to about 28% of our budget - not too bad.

As far as pledges and loose offerings go, we are right on target, thanks to you! The Church Council would like to thank you for your faithful weekly contributions. We appreciate

your generous support! If you would like to find out how you are doing with your personal pledge, please see Ron Emery for the details.
