Christian Education: Welcome Sunday school for both adults & children will be starting up again the Sunday after Labor Day (Sept. 10). Until July, it had been some time since we had done a "congregation's choice" for one of our hymns. It really had slipped my mind that we used to do that on occasion. A number of people told me that they enjoyed the choice &

it's so nice to have everyone get a chance to hear at least part of their favorites. We will definitely be doing this more frequently, perhaps once every month or two, so be thinking about what you would like to hear! You will have a chance to make your request.

Finance & Stewardship:

Many churches across the country are facing decreasing membership & increasing median age. South China Community Church (SCCC) is no different. The challenge we face as we plan for our long-term future is to increase our membership & bring new energy & ideas into the congregation.

We recently sent out a mailer to all 1,840 mailbox holders in the Town of China; the cost of the mailers was paid entirely through contributions from two church members. For 39¢ each (less than the cost of a first-class stamp), the mailers were designed, printed & mailed out, with an additional 250 mailers available at church for distribution.

Our monetary assets presently total approximately \$96,800. This year's budgeted offering income of \$53,555 is by far our largest source of revenue. The good news is that we have not had to take money from the Memorial Fund to pay operating expenses since February. The bad news is that as of August 6th, our collections are at 81% of where they should be, leaving a \$6,684 Our shortfall. members are incredibly generous, but if our congregation is to survive & thrive in the long-term, we must increase our revenue by increasing our membership.

Approximately 85% of our monetary assets are invested in three guaranteed annuities, purchased this past April. They continue to grow & generate interest (\$612.10 in interest in less than 3½ months).

Thank you all for your generosity. We will continue to do our best to operate as efficiently & effectively as possible, as well as maintain & increase the church's financial stability. — Respectfully, Finance Chair, John Glowa
