
Joshua 1:9

Missions & Benevolence:

Because we are not actively assisting any families right now & refer new requests for food to the China Food Pantry, our Benevolence Committee continues to make a \$25 monthly contribution to the Pantry. Lois Rogers, who is a member of the Benevolence Committee & also volunteers at the China Food Pantry, recently called our attention to an urgent need for canned soup &

the continued need for fresh carrots, onions & plastic bags of any size. Thanks for your continued response to these requests.



Just another reminder to please support PDF (Pastor's Discretionary Fund) offerings on the months that have a 5th Sunday (the next is July 29th) as this enables Pastor Paul to meet the smaller emergency requests he receives without having to ask the congregation for

special donations. Some of the aid requests he has mentioned since our last newsletter are helping a family with their electric bill; helping Arlene, the elderly lady in Albion, with further

wheel chair repairs as well as providing funds for her overnight stay prior to an early morning surgery. Later, Pastor Paul received a \$75 donation from Arlene; since he strongly feels that PDF assistance does not have to be repaid, he



wanted her donation to go to Special Missions. Thanks to this donation, the Benevolence Committee was able to increase its mission donation [see below]. A special thank you to the Outreach ladies who make the candy for PDF donations at our Turkey Pie suppers & to those of you who support the PDF donations that allowed Pastor Paul to meet these requests. As noted previously, he does other good deeds we don't know about!

Our Committee received a request from Alexis Porter of the Kennebec Community Church in Augusta, in which she outlined her August mission trip with *Healing Haiti* (an organization that works in Haiti providing clean water, food, housing & education). Some of you may remember that in 2016 we sent her a donation towards her mission trip to El Salvador; we later received a thank-you letter & pictures taken during her mission. Committee members voted to send \$100 from our Benevolence budget, which was increased by the \$75 donation from Arlene. A thank-you letter was received from Alexis & I will pass this on to Pastor Paul to share with the congregation.

We recently had a request through our website from a Mom for birthday gifts for her child. This was referred to Pastor Paul & he followed up by leaving a message for the Mom that we had new toys at the church & she could set a time to come & see if any were appropriate for her child. She did not reply, so we were left wondering if she was more interested in receiving cash - a good reason to have aid requests filtered through Pastor Paul. Finance & Stewardship:

Thank you all for your extreme generosity, both with your time & financially. Each year that the budget is created, the Council uses the "Offerings" revenue category to balance the budget, expecting that actual offerings will not total the amount projected. That is the case to date.

As of June 30, 2018, our total projected revenue is \$32,500 & our total actual revenue is only \$27,082 for a difference of -\$5,418. Both fundraising & offering revenues are currently below the projected amounts. We expect that fundraising revenue will greatly increase in coming months.

Our projected weekly offering average is \$997 & we are very close to that with an actual weekly offering average of \$974. Our expenditures of \$32,265 are slightly over the projected amount of \$31,532 for a difference of \$732. To date, our total expenditures exceed total revenues by \$5,183.

On a positive note, our three annuity accounts have grown from an initial investment of \$81,828 to \$84,498 for an increase of \$2,670 in approximately fifteen months' time. At the end of the five-year period, the annuities will generate approximately \$10,000 in revenue for the church. Our best opportunity to end 2018 in the black is by supporting our church fundraising efforts. Thank you all again for your help & support! – Respectfully, Finance Chair, John Glowa

"Jesus loves me! This I know..."

Did you ever wonder about the background of this favorite children's hymn?

The words to this simple song were written as a poem in 1860 by two sisters, Susan Bogert Warner & Anna Bartlett Warner. William Batchelder Bradbury (born in York, ME) found the poem & set it to music in 1862. While doing so, he added the famous chorus.

In some hymnals, it was originally entitled, "China." Why? I can't seem to find out; however, it was the favorite hymn of Japeth Washburn, who named his town China, Maine in honor of his favorite hymn. It's one of the most beloved hymns of Christian tradition.

Now, as Paul Harvey used to say, "You know the rest of the story." Though often looked down upon as a mere child's hymn, Dr. Karl Barth, considered by many to be the greatest theologian of the 20th century, remarked that all his lengthy, scholarly writings could be summarized in the words, *Jesus loves me*, this I know, for the Bible tells me so.




THE CENTIPEDE
