#### CHURCH COUNCIL NEWS

#### President's Report:

A great deal has changed since our last newsletter! The Council had its last inperson meeting on March 10<sup>th</sup>, but due to the Covid-19 pandemic restrictions put in place by the Governor, carried out its church business with e-mail meetings & votes during April, May & June.

We resumed our inperson meetings, with masks & socialdistancing, on July 14<sup>th</sup>. Barring any new virus concerns, we will continue to meet the second Tuesday of each month at

As always, the Committee Chairs share information during our monthly meetings which is recorded in the Secretary's monthly report, which is posted on the bulletin board in Memorial Hall. Please feel free to read this for current information.

The Council's process of reviewing the bylaws was completed & the revisions were approved at the January Annual Meeting; a copy is posted on the bulletin board.

During my document research regarding the Church Sales Tax Exemption, however, I came across information which was not common knowledge to the present Council members nor probably most of the congregation. I felt it was important enough to be included in the Church by-laws & addressed it at our July 14th meeting. Council members asked that I draft the proposed by-law change, which I have e-mailed to them for comments and/or approval. After Council approval, this proposed change will be presented to the congregation.



As a reminder, the Council implemented the suggestion made at the 2019 Annual Meeting about starting budget review in

the preliminary budget review in September, with the Finance Officer presenting it to the congregation for comments in October, followed by the November mailing of our annual pledge letter/request to the congregation. This worked out well, as having the pledge information before the end of the year helped with final planning. We will follow the same procedure this year.

As you know, due to the virus & the Governor's health restrictions, our last inhouse church service was held on March 15<sup>th</sup> & the Council, with Pastor Paul's input, cancelled services for the immediate future. Much appreciation goes to Pastor Paul, Chris Faris, Russell Poulin & volunteer soloists for the services which are available on the church website. I also appreciate the efforts of the Flock Leaders to keep in touch with their flock members during this difficult time in our lives.

In-person church services, with masks, social-distancing & no fellowship, resumed June 7<sup>th</sup>. The services are still being recorded & are available on our website.

In-person attendance is averaging 23 per week, including Pastor Paul & Chris,

reflecting that many of you are still sheltering in place at home. We miss seeing you, but respect your need to stay safe.



As I mentioned in the March newsletter, the Council voted to continue paving our staff during the cancellation of church services & respectfully suggested that our Church Family consider mailing their pledges, tithes, loose offerings, & PDF donations to our Assistant Treasurer: Ronald Emery, 267 Alder Park Road, South China, ME 04358. Because you have responded so well to this request & some have generously increased their pledges to help defray our fund-raising losses, we have not had to withdraw monies from the Memorial Savings except for the \$3,000 which was included in the 2020 budget for the repairs to Memorial Hall.



We certainly owe a debt of gratitude to Bob Webber & Ron Maxwell for the many hours they have devoted to the Memorial Hall project. It is beautiful, but not yet in use as

the floor is curing. In appreciation, they were each given a small stipend, but I find that Ron conveniently "lost" enough receipts for project costs that his stipend was returned. We still have available the \$4,000 Charitable Grant made by Anna & Peyton Forbes for use as needed; this can be transferred from the Living Memorial Fund to the church checking account.

Regarding our usual fund-raising, as you know, we have not been able to have any Turkey Pie Suppers & the August Summer Sale/Cookie Walk was also cancelled.

However, thanks go to Sheldon Goodine & Darlene Zimmerman who headed up a "Drive-Thru" Chicken Barbecue, which was held on Saturday, August 8th. This turned out to be a tremendous success with a profit of \$793! I give a hearty "thanks" to all who made the potato salad or worked to make this event such a success. Several customers expressed appreciation to us for having the barbeque & getting them "out of the house"!



Sheldon & Darlene have expressed their wish & willingness to coordinate another "Drive-Thru" BBQ on Saturday, September 26<sup>th</sup>, so you will get another chance to

participate in this community mission fund-raising project.

During this difficult time, please remember to keep in touch by e-mail, text or phone with church friends, especially the elderly or ill, to help combat the feeling of isolation. - Glenna Jordan, President



#### Missions & Benevolence:

The Benevolence Fund continues to make a \$25 monthly contribution to the China Food Pantry; we have received no requests for additional assistance because of the pandemic.

As usual, I would like to remind folks to please support the PDF (Pastor's Discretionary Fund) offerings on the months that have a fifth Sunday (August 30 & November 29) as these & other cash donations enable Pastor Paul to meet the emergency requests that he receives

without having to ask the congregation for special donations. The aid requests he has received since our last newsletter were to help two families with rent expenses. Thanks to those who made special cash donations, as well as the fifth Sunday PDF donations, that allowed Pastor Paul to meet these requests.

Again, a very special "thank-you" to Susie who has, since the resumption of inperson church services, been providing delicious baked goods left over from her Farmer's Market baking. Our share of the donations is added to Pastor Paul's PDF account & is available when he gets calls.

One issue that you may not be aware of is the e-mail scam from someone using Pastor Paul's name to ask for gift cards. The Council members alerted all in their Flocks to be aware of this. Please know that Pastor Paul would never ask for gift cards as he usually checks with me regarding his PDF balance & then gets a check from the Treasurer.

Please let Pastor Paul or me know of anyone needing emergency assistance. Thanks again for your sharing & caring and "God Bless". - Glenna Jordan, Deacon/ Benevolence Chair



#### Finance & Stewardship:

Our year-to-date revenue of \$32,983.54 represents a deficit of \$8,533.95 when compared to our budgeted expenses of \$41,517.49. The unbudgeted income gift of \$10,000, however, reflects a budget gain of \$1,466.05. Janet Preston will provide the Draft 2021 Preliminary Budget

to Council members prior to its September 8<sup>th</sup> meeting.




