Finance & Stewardship:

Happy Summer! Once again, our church finances continue to hold their own, thanks to lower than anticipated expenses & higher than anticipated offerings.

As of June 30, 2021, our budgeted actual revenue for the year to date is \$30,493.70; our expenses as of June 30, 2021 were \$30,433.65 for a <u>surplus</u> so far this year of \$60.05. Our budgeted revenue is \$5,178.45 less than anticipated, due primarily to less than anticipated fundraising revenue. On the positive side, our expenses are also \$10,477 less than anticipated for this time of the year.



The boating store was having a big sale on canoes. It was quite an oar deal.


