Finance & Stewardship:

Happy Fall! Once again, our church finances continue to hold their own, thanks to lower than anticipated expenses & higher than anticipated offerings.

As of October 31, 2021, our budgeted actual revenue for the year to date is \$54,951.95. Our expenses as of October 31, 2021 total \$54,071.40 for a **surplus** so far this year of \$880.55. Our budgeted revenue is \$5,416.30 less than anticipated due primarily to less than anticipated fundraising revenue. On the positive side, our expenses are also approximately \$5,144.00 less than anticipated for this time of the year.
